- Parents are to ensure that their child arrives to school on time. The first bell rings at 7:50am, the tardy bell rings at 8:00 am. Students must be in their seats by the start of class at 8:00 a.m. as published in the Student Handbook. Any student arriving after this time will be issued a tardy slip. Students accumulating ten (10) unexcused tardies per school year will receive a note for excessive tardiness. Continued tardiness and absences may require a meeting with parents to draft an action plan to remedy this issue.
- Parents are to contact the school office if their son/daughter (the student) is going to be absent. On the day the student returns to school, he/she must bring a doctor's note or note from the parent(s) explaining the reason for the absence, otherwise, the absence will be considered unexcused.
- The school believes that parents play an integral role in their child's educational and social life. For this reason, the school asks that a parent/guardian personally transport their child to and from school. Carpooling is permitted, as it too, positively contributes to the child's socio-educational life.

Florida Tax Credit Scholarship

Please note: Applications are processed in the order they are received, including all supporting documentation. Scholarships are awarded with a priority given to renewal families followed by new families with the greatest financial need.

Students who qualify will receive financial assistance toward either private school tuition and fees or transportation to a public school in another county/district.

Eligibility/Priority Criteria:

- ✓ Age Eligibility:
 - Students entering Kindergarten must be 5 on or before Sept. 1.
 - Students entering first grade must be 6 on or before Sept.1.
- ✓ Income Eligibility:
 - If a member of the household receives SNAP (food stamps), TANF, or FDPIR, the student may qualify.
 - If the household income qualifies for free or reduce-priced lunch, the student may qualify.
 - If the household income is at/or below the income criteria found in the chart below titled “Eligibility Chart”, the student may qualify.
- ✓ Priority:

Scholarships are awarded with priority given to renewal families followed by new families with the greatest financial need. If the household income is **more** than the income criteria on the chart below titled ‘Priority’, the student, while eligible, will be placed on a waiting list until all renewal families and new families whose income is below the amounts on the ‘Priority’ chart have received funding. If, at that time, funds are still available, students on the waiting list will be awarded in the order their applications were received, including all supporting documentation.

Gardiner Scholarship

This scholarship is for Florida students 3 years old through 12th grade or age 22, whichever comes first, with one of the following disabilities: **Autism spectrum disorder, Muscular dystrophy, Cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, Phelan McDermid syndrome, Prader-Willi syndrome, Spina bifida, Williams syndrome, Intellectual disability (severe cognitive impairment), rare diseases as defined by the National Organization for Rare Disorders, anaphylaxis, deaf, visually impaired, dual sensory impaired, traumatic brain injured, hospital or homebound as defined by the rules of the State Board of Education and evidenced by reports from local school districts, or three, four or five year-olds who are deemed high-risk due to developmental delays.**

The term "hospital or homebound" includes a student who has a medically diagnosed physical or psychiatric condition or illness, as defined by the state board in rule, and who is confined to the home or hospital for more than 6 months.

- ✓ Students need an IEP written in accordance with the rules of the State Board of Education or with the rules of another state OR the diagnosis of a Florida physician or psychologist or a physician who holds an active license issued by another state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.
- ✓ Students must be at least 3 or 4 on or before Sept 1. Students entering kindergarten must be 5 on or before Sept 1. Students entering first grade must be 6 on or before Sept 1.
- ✓ Students can participate in the Gardiner Scholarship program as part of home education. However, they cannot be enrolled in a public school or receive any other state-sponsored scholarship (McKay Scholarship or the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship).

Hope Scholarship

In 2018, the Florida Legislature created the Hope Scholarship Program to give public school children in Florida relief from bullying and violence. The scholarship gives parents the opportunity to transfer their child to another K-12 public school with available capacity within the school district, receive a scholarship to transport the student to a public school in another school district, or to request a scholarship for the student to attend an eligible private school. Step Up For Students is administering the private school and transportation options for the Hope Scholarship.

A qualifying incident must have taken place at a public K-12 educational institution, any school-related or school-sponsored program or activity, riding on the school bus or waiting at the school bus stop. Qualifying incidents include battery; harassment; hazing; bullying; kidnapping; physical attack; robbery; sexual offenses, harassment, assault or battery; threat or intimidation; or fighting at school as defined by the Florida Department of Education in accordance with s. 1006.09(6).

Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, once a student submits a report of an incident that occurred on or after August 1, 2018, the school principal, or his/her designee, will investigate the incident. Once the investigation is complete, or within 15 days after the incident was reported, whichever occurs first, the principal, or his/her designee, must notify the parent about the Hope Scholarship Program, and provide the parent with the completed Hope Scholarship Notification Form (Form IEPC-HS1), which is required for Step Up For Students to determine scholarship eligibility.

The Hope Scholarship Program is not based on financial need. Families may choose between transferring to another public school within the school district, financial assistance toward private school tuition and fees, or transportation costs to attend a public school in another district.

Both the private school scholarship and the transportation scholarship have the same eligibility requirements.

Applications, including all supporting documents, are processed in the order they are received and scholarships are awarded pending funding availability. Scholarship funding can be transferred to other eligible schools if the student moves within the state, or simply wants to attend a different participating private school.

The student may keep the scholarship – depending on available funding and notification of renewal – until the student returns to public school or graduates from high school, whichever occurs first.

Please note, private school scholarship funds are sent directly to the school in which the child is enrolled.

Reading Scholarship

In 2018, Florida became the first state to offer an education savings account program for students enrolled in public schools. The Reading Scholarship, administered by Step Up For Students, was created to help public school students in third through fifth grade who struggle with reading. The program offers parents access to education savings accounts, worth \$500 each, to pay for tuition and fees related to part-time tutoring, summer and after-school literacy programs, instructional materials and curriculum related to reading or literacy.

Eligibility:

- ✓ Third- through fifth-grade public school students who scored a 1 or 2 on the third or fourth grade English Language Arts section of the Florida Standards Assessment in the prior year.
- ✓ Students who are classified as English Language Learners, and who are enrolled in a program or receiving services that are specifically designed to meet the instructional needs of English Language Learner students, will receive priority.

McKay Scholarship Program

The McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, originally created in 1999, provides scholarships for eligible students with disabilities to attend an eligible public or private school of their choice. Students with disabilities include K-12 students who are documented as having an intellectual disability; a speech or language impairment; a hearing impairment, including deafness; a visual impairment, including blindness; a dual sensory impairment; an orthopedic impairment, another health impairment, an emotional or behavioral disability; a specific learning disability, including, but not limited to, dyslexia, dyscalculia, or developmental aphasia; a traumatic brain injury; a developmental delay; or autism spectrum disorder.

What options are available to a student with disabilities under the McKay Scholarship Program?

An eligible student with disabilities has several options available, including:

- ✓ Attendance at another public school within the district;
- ✓ Attendance at an eligible public school in an adjacent district that has space and provides the services identified in the student's individual education plan or 504 accommodation plan; or
- ✓ Attendance at an eligible private, sectarian or nonsectarian, school

Who is eligible for a McKay Scholarship?

Any parent of a public school student with a disability who has an Individual Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 accommodation plan may receive a McKay Scholarship if the student meets the following requirements:

- ✓ The student has spent the prior school year in attendance at a Florida public school (the student was enrolled and reported by a Florida school district for funding during the preceding October and February FTE surveys in Pre-K through grade 12), **or**
- ✓ The student was enrolled and reported for funding by the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind during the preceding October and February student membership surveys in kindergarten through grade 12, **or**
- ✓ The student received services under the Specialized Instructional Services (SIS) program during the previous school year and has a current IEP developed by the local school board in accordance with State Board Rule or a 504 accommodation plan, **or**
- ✓ The student is a foster child or is a dependent child of a member of the United States Armed Forces who transfers to Florida from out of state due to a parent's permanent change of station orders, **and**
- ✓ The parent has notified the school district in a manner that creates a written or electronic record of the notification (this is done by filing intent on the School Choice website) at least 60 days prior to the date of the first scholarship payment, **and**
- ✓ The parent has obtained acceptance for admission of the student to a private school that is eligible for the program.

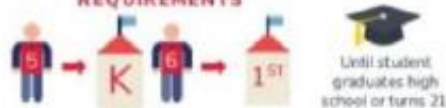
